"OUR FATHER" ON FATHER'S DAY

A couple of weeks ago the same letter appeared in two different national news papers asking the question " *What shall I do with all the photographs I have? Here I am in my late seventies, my sons do not want them, shall I burn them or what?*" The letter triggered some emotional moments for me because I had been sorting pictures of Mark and my other two children. VE day had made me remember my father and the small black and white photographs I had of him. Of the things we did together. Teaching me to ride a bike. During those dreadful days of the war he made me a Flying Fortress bomber - carved out of wood whilst with his companion firemen as they were waiting for the next call out to a fire. Most of all finding him on his knees daily with an open Bible calling out to the Lord

Now here we are Father's day once again a time of memories and gratitude for many. Yet for others horrendous stories of family abuse, all too many fathers who were (and still are) unworthy and unloving even unknown. - so we talk of absentee fathers. Broken homes with all the sadness that brings. Can I share with you a very simple reflection on what we call the Lord's Prayer something we say or sing in about 30 seconds yet takes a lifetime to live out its tremendous truths. It is so familiar but if you think about it this is one of God's ways of awakening your soul, stirring your faith, strengthening your vision, captivating your love.

THE REQUEST "Teach us to pray"

We are people making our way through a dark, frightening at times world full of so much uncertainty and confusion. Many voices are raised telling us what to do and who we are. The disciples watched Jesus closely. They saw how He prayed often up in the hills, out by the sea, in a quiet garden. He always returned back to them more rested, more certain, more determined, more at peace than before, unafraid, purposeful. If only He could teach them how it was done so they asked Him "Lord, teach us to pray" and so He did.

THE RESULT " Our FATHER

" *When you pray say " Our Father"* and it was an amazing, awesome truth that we could know God as our heavenly Father. Something never expressed before. To help us grasp this incredible concept Jesus told a parable about a prodigal son and the kind, loving, caring nature of the prodigal's father. How he was waiting with open arms to celebrate his son's return. It lets us know that God is a Father who waits, who forgives, who is approachable, affectionate (" *threw his arms around him*") waiting in the same kind of way to lavish gifts and blessings upon us BUT most of all a father who forgives. (*Luke 15:11-14*)

On another occasion Jesus made it so clear that God our Father is so specially involved with us (*Read Luke 11:1-13*) "You know how to give good gifts to your children ... how much more will your Father in heaven give the Holy Spirit to them that ask Him" . The more you discover that He is a Father who loves His children, will discipline if prudent but most of all One who provides us with the encouragement to fully live our lives as His redeemed children. It is so distinctly personal with a warmth in the relationship that helps us to reflect Him to the world at large.

THE REALISATION "OUR Father"

Two words that establish the exciting confession that make us aware of our two way relationship. Simple but profound. In a relationship with God and so we belong to each other. We are brothers and sisters. This is more than a prayer but a creed that will help us together to march on through whatever confronts us in this life. He is OUR Father - we are family, linked together by Divine grace. No human barriers to divide us - Christ makes us one. Sons and daughters, brothers and sisters. What a privilege. **DPS**
