BIBLE VERSE FOR THE WEEK

Psalm 125

**" As the mountains surround Jerusalem so the Lord
surrounds His people both now and for evermore" (v2)**

SURROUNDED

With our thoughts turning to how the lockdown restrictions could be safely lifted and we could possibly get back to church again. We were asking when would ministers ever judge the situation to be safe. This ongoing argument about in protecting the most vulnerable is it worth the cost the rest of society is bearing? And what about the children and their education? Then suddenly the eruption of violent protest and behaviour as the "*Black lives matter*" spilled over all around the world. Did you read the vitriolic full page in the local Echo as the young 25 year old political activist from Hockley as she raged at the MP because he said "*all lives matter*". Her comment that if we say something like that we are using "*outdated language*" Is this not a basic feature of the Gospel that "*all lives matter to God*" ? How sad it has been to see those going to supposedly peaceful protests armed with rockets, missiles, ropes and grappling hooks bent on throwing missiles at horses, tearing down or defacing monuments. **At the same time** parliament passed the second reading of the "*Quickie divorce*" Bill and discussed suspending Sunday trading Laws to boost the economy. Do not be misled if they are suspended they will never come back and all we fought for to "*Keep Sunday Special*" in 2008 will be lost. Overwhelmed ,surrounded by so much made me think how at **one and the same time** we are surrounded by something else so I turned to Psalm 125 to remind myself "*the Lord surrounds His people NOW*".

THE SETTING

Sometimes we think the Christian life should be exempt from setbacks, shipwrecks, car crashes, storms, earthquakes, cancer and a whole range of accidents, troubles and illnesses that we experience along with everyone else. The pilgrim was wrestling with issues as he makes his way to Jerusalem. It was tough going. A foreign invader now ruled the land, evil has the upper hand (just read the Psalm again). It was the sixth Psalm of ascent up to Jerusalem so he would be singing it. Do you realise, as he did, what shakes you up will not shake you apart (v1) - God will make you as solid as Mount Zion. Then comes the realisation that nothing can penetrate God's inner ring of protection "*as the mountains surround ...*". Adversity and sorrow, setbacks and frustrations are nothing but an outer circle . God is close, so very close, there for you and it is a fact more permanent than even the mountains around Jerusalem. True for the pilgrim singing AND the psalm song is true for US in our situation today.

THE SEQUENCE

We are surrounded by God's PROMISES

"He has given us His very great and precious promises so that through them you may participate in the divine nature" 2 Peter 1:4 (NIV)

Do you recall the Sunday school chorus "*Every promise in the Book is mine*". I cannot validate this but it is reckoned there are more than 365 promises in your Bible -one for every day ! Peter makes such an incredible statement preceding the above text by saying "*His divine power gives us everything we need for life*". What does it all mean? Simply that you have the guarantee of God's presence for anything and everything.

We are surrounded by God's PEACE.

"and the peace of God which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus" Philippians 4:7

Probably the most sought after thing in our troubled world yet seemingly so elusive, so difficult to secure, so difficult to find. Why? Peace is not something we earn or deserve. It is a gift from God. The wonderful promise of Jesus is "*My peace I give to you*" (John 14)

We are surrounded by God's POWER.

"we are kept by the power of God through faith (1Peter1:5)

God uses ordinary people like us to do extraordinary things and His is the power that enables us to cope, to do, to dare, to be what He wants us to be. In these difficult times just remember **WHO** surrounds you. **DPS**
